COMING IN MAY 2021:

THE CENTER FOR MEDICAL EDUCATION AND RESEARCH

If you've passed by the Medical Center campus recently, you may have noticed a flurry of activity including some new fencing with brightly colored "Coming Soon" signage. A new building – the Center for Medical Education and Research – is in the works, and what happens inside will improve health outcomes for generations to come.

Cape Fear Valley Health launched an initiative in 2017 to address physician shortages by becoming a teaching hospital and establishing a Medical Residency Program. Newly graduated physicians do not immediately go into practice; they enter a residency program for 3-5 years for hands-on training in their chosen field.

Our Residency Program, now in its third year, has grown to include more than 100 physician residents – and we are bursting at the seams. At full capacity, 300 residents will be on site! With a home in the future five-story Center for Medical Education and Research, our Residency Program will increase the number of patients served each year and the quality of their care.

The center will include an auditorium large enough to hold all our residents, faculty, interns and staff, as well as lecture and classroom space. It will also house a state-of-the-art simulation lab to provide hands-on training in a broad range of medical interventions. Residents will be able to practice difficult labor deliveries, inserting chest tubes, surgical techniques, and more – all utilizing high-tech, responsive mannequins.

This project will also have an enduring positive impact on the region's economy. According to a study by Michael Walden, Chief Economist at North Carolina State University, the Residency Program will create 923 jobs and generate \$574 million over 10 years.

The center is scheduled to open in May 2021. Stay tuned for progress reports along the way!

CAPE FEAR VALLEY HEALTH FOUNDATION LAUNCHES CARING FOR THE FUTURE CAMPAIGN

Cape Fear Valley Health Foundation has announced the launch of its CARING for the FUTURE campaign, in support of the new Center for Medical Education and Research. The building, slated to open in late spring 2021, will serve as the home for the Medical Residency Program, as well as the Neuroscience Institute. The five-story building includes one entire floor for future growth, as



well as expansion space for the Neuroscience Institute and the Residency Program's Simulation Lab.

Of the \$28.3 million project cost, 75% has already been secured through lead gifts from the Thomas R.

McLean Foundation, Cape Fear Valley Health Foundation and the Cape Fear Valley Volunteer Auxiliary board.

The Foundation has committed to raising \$3 million from the community and regional foundations to support this project. Employees and employed physicians are able to contribute to the building during our annual employee giving campaign.

Now we are asking our community to invest along with us to strengthen the health of our home not just for ourselves, but for our children, their children, and generations to come.


