



A new, comprehensive Cancer Center means more patients can stay in Harnett County for every aspect of their treatment, close to their families and support systems. Through this project, we anticipate expanding our Harnett-based cancer services to include radiation oncology with the latest technologies and adding 17,000 square feet of space to provide greater care for more patients. With a dedicated Radiation Oncologist on staff, a patient's entire care team will now be accessible in one location.

The Dorothea Dix Adolescent Care Unit


is now a lifeline for adolescents in the local community who need psychiatric crisis care (Before this facility opened, the nearest adolescent psychiatric treatment facility in North Carolina would be 60 miles away). During their stay, youth participate in individual, group and/or family counseling, with a focus on evidence-based adaptive skill building as a foundation for successful reintegration into the community. Donors help the Foundation provide resources for patient support needs and programs, as well as resources for therapeutic play.

Donor support continues to improve the lives of our smallest patients and their families by providing funding for the latest state-of-the-art technologies.

Local families like the Lewis family benefit from the generosity of donors who help fund care enhancement projects like the NicView Camera system, which helps parents of hospitalized infants' bond with their children even when they can't be in the NICU.

Ongoing donor support has sustained many comfort and wellness initiatives including providing car seats to families in need, supporting breastfeeding mothers, and helping families with accommodations when a child is hospitalized.

Cape Fear Valley Hoke Hospital's emergency department recently benefitted from community generosity with the addition of a mobile distraction station for patients undergoing testing and treatment.
